SYNOPSIS:

In search of an un-detectable poison, Sangstrom, a seemingly ordinary man, seeks out a sagacious druggist at his eerie apothecary. The canny druggist requires him to prove his merit, igniting a cat-and-mouse game that winds up with Sangstrom getting more than he bargained for.

ABOUT THE PRODUCTION:

“The Hobbyist” was awarded the Paula Rhodes Memorial Award, presented to George Vatisas by SVA as an Honors Master’s Degree Candidate.

The short film is based on the 1961 Short Story by the same title written by Fredric Brown.

“The Hobbyist” was shot in the East Village, Lower East Side and Flatbush neighborhoods of New York City over two and a half days in 2016. It was filmed on the Arri Alexa with Anamorphic lenses to achieve a textured, vintage aesthetic.

The film was edited using Adobe Premiere Pro, and finally completed in early 2017.

“The Hobbyist” is the second short film written and directed by George Vatisas.

The film is George Vatisas’ graduate thesis film at the School of Visual Arts’ Live Action Short Film Masters program, of which D. M. Night Maire is also an alumnus.
